States, the Court may decide, like California, that the right to due process for the accused at the pre-trial level, especially at the time of a lineup, may require more than merely counsel being present. The United States Supreme Court could require that when the accused is put before a lineup, not only must counsel be present, but also that other people in the lineup must bear a fair resemblance to the one accused of the crime.
